The Education Outreach Committee of the Board of Directors then reviews the applications and selects a recipient. The Peninsula Music Festival Scholarship is awarded for three years beginning with the sophomore year and continuing through the senior year. The recipient must send an annual update plus proof of continuing registration as a music student

"The committee was so impressed with Spencer's essay and accomplishments," said PMF Executive Director Sharon Grutzmacher. "He has worked extremely hard to keep music part of his life and recognizes its importance in his success as he continues his education."

The Peninsula Music Festival will honor Spencer at the concert on Thursday, August 9 with his whole family in attendance.
